SUMMARY & BIO

Dr. Edwin Castellanos will give a talk at this week's Tropilunch, a weekly seminar run by graduate students from the Tropical Conservation and Development (TCD) Program. Dr. Castellanos has done research on adaptation and mitigation to climate change in Guatemala for the past 20 years. He was a lead author in the IPCC 5th report on climate change for the Central and South America Chapters.



Dr. Castellanos will discuss the adaptation and mitigation efforts currently underway in Mesoamerica with an emphasis in Guatemala that results from the highly variable and unusual climate experienced in the last two decades by different population groups in the region.
